

ADDENDUM

TO

Oregon-Columbia Chapter The Associated General Contractors of America, Inc.

Pursuant to article 21 of the current Master Labor Agreement the Undersigned parties listed below hereby agree, to modify the terms and conditions in the Carpenters Master Labor Agreement dated June 1, 2006, which was negotiated between Oregon-Columbia Chapter The Associated General Contractors of America, Inc. (MLA) and The Pacific Northwest regional Council Of Carpenters Of The United Brotherhood Of Carpenters and Joiners of America, to Cover the period of time between 1 June 2006 to 31 May 2009.

This Modification is limited to the following items:

Type of Project: All work Covered by the MLA

Modification: Article 29 Classifications: Piledrivers Groups I, II, and III

New Language

Carpenter Group 5 (Bridge and Highway Carpenter)

Primary Purpose:

Performs work related to the construction or maintenance of bridges, Viaducts, Underpasses, Walls, Subways, Overhead Crossings, and similar structures to include both temporary and permanent.

Typical Duties:

- Builds and sets forms for concrete work and precast concrete used in the construction or maintenance of bridges and Highway construction. See "Carpenters Group 6 (Piledrivers)" for form work related to the construction of piles. See "Cement Mason" for the setting of sidewalk forms. See "Ironworker" for the erection of structural steel.
- For bridges over water, builds and sets forms for the piers, columns, or abutments of approaches to the first pier or abutment on the water's edge. See "Carpenter Group 6 (Piledrivers) for the first pier or abutment on the water's edge.
- Erects and removes falsework used to perform work under the Bridge and Highway construction classification. See "Carpenters Group 6 (Piledrivers)" for the erection and removal of heavy timber and/or pile falsework.

- Strips and repairs reusable forms and reusable form materials, including component forms, for concrete work used in the construction of the Bridges, & Highway construction. See “Laborer Group 1” for the stripping of non-reusable forms and non-reusable form materials. Also see “Laborer Group 1” for cleaning and prepping of reusable forms.

Welders receive \$.75 above their group’s rate.

When working with creosote and other toxic, treated wood and steel material, shall receive \$.25 per hour premium pay for minimum of eight (8) hours.

Note of Clarification: Carpenters Group 5 (Bridge and Highway) receives current Piledrivers Group 1 wages and Fringes.

Carpenter, Group 6 (Piledrivers)

Primary Purpose:

Performs pile work and drives piles of any type, including but not limited to wood, steel, concrete, and/or composite materials temporary and/or permanent. Including Pile driving work related to waterfront and marine installations temporary and/or permanent. See “Power Equipment Operator” for operation of equipment.

Typical Duties:

- Constructs bridges made of heavy timber.
- Erects and removes falsework made of heavy timber
- Constructs such waterfront and marine facilities as docks, piers, wharves, bulkheads, jetties, and similar structures.
- Erects and removes falsework used to perform work under Piledrivers classification.
- Sets up equipment for raising and placing of piles
- Rigging of piles in leads, places cushion caps on piles to prevent splitting, guides piles, plumbs piles, and signals operators to begin or cease hammering unless controlled remotely from the ground.
- Drives, sets, stavs, stresses, proofs, splices, welds, cuts off, and caps piles.
- Drives sheet piling to shore and brace excavations related to pile driving work, including but not limited to the installation of lagging and all attachments to piles.

- For bridges over water, erects forms for the capping of piles, piers, and columns and for the pier or abutment on land that is nearest to the water's edge. Strips and repairs such forms and form materials, including form components, if reusable. See "Laborer Group 1" for stripping of non reusable forms and form materials. Also see "Laborer Group 1" for cleaning and prepping of reusable forms.
- Constructs and installs cofferdams and caissons, and places and removes all casings, permanent or temporary, required to install piling. Includes drilled vertical shafts that support piles or pylons.

Welders receive \$.75 above their group's rate.

When working with creosote and other toxic, treated wood and steel material, diesel hammer, shall receive \$.25 per hour premium pay for minimum of eight (8) hours.

When working in sheet pile coffer dams or cells up to the external water level shall receive \$.15 premium pay for minimum of eight (8) hours.

Note of Clarification: Effective 1 January 2008 Carpenter Group 6 (Piledrivers) receives \$.50 above the current Piledrivers Group 5 wages and Fringes.
