Subject: Master Labor Agreement negotiation developments and ballot

Reference: (a) Laborers - Understanding of Agreement, Draft IV, 6/1
(b) Carpenters - Memorandum of Understanding, dated 6/1 8

Dear Mr. Campbell:

There are two new developments in the Spring 1988 Master Labor Agreement negotiations. Reference (a) is a follow-up to the May 24, 1988 letter, wherein the flagger wage rate issue was addressed. Attached is the tentative document, regarding Laborers' negotiations. Changes have been in the addition of Items No. 5 and No. 6., pertaining to increase in the Flagger wage rates.

The immediate impact of Flaggers increases will be alleviated by long negotiated concerning:

- (1) Protection of wages on old work
- (2) Existing provisions in the Master Agreement protection of wages on Davis-Bacon work

Whereby, Flagger wage increases will not be payable on private work bid before June 1, 1989 nor on public work that does not have the election within the bid specifications.

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
Any contractors who have adopted the Laborers tentative agreement based on earlier circulated Draft versions, who feel that this is not an acceptable change, please contact me immediately.

Reference (b) was negotiated with the Carpenters for Private Works and to ensure the ability of contractors to obtain Special Project Agreements (SPA). This understanding was negotiated to allay any fears about Carpenter signatory contractors being able to maintain their competitive flexibility.

Ballots. Contractors, who have not yet forwarded their ballots adopting or declining the proposed labor contracts are asked to do so without delay.
